Meeting called to order at 7:00pm

**Dole- statistician at UNM.** Analyzed call analysis for Bel Air 311 calls in Jan. and Feb. Equipment for presentation was not available so he gave information. Over 50% of calls were graffiti related. Less than 5% of calls took over 5 days to resolve with the majority being taken care of the same day.

**Chris Sylvan – Neighborhood Sweep.** Opened for questions about the Zoning sweep that will take place after clean-up day in May. No questions were brought forth.

**Secretary –** It was moved and seconded that the minutes from 10/20/14 as published in Newsletter be accepted. All voted affirmatively.

**President's Report -** Amy presented 2015 budget as approved by Board. Noted that she was able to get a substantial reduction in the printing costs of the first newsletter. We will be adding current memberships to cover costs for this year and can now use credit or debit cards using Square app. Amy noted that the Board needs more membership participation.

**Committee Reports:**

**Calendar-** 2015 calendar was reviewed. Board has approved all dates.

**Newsletter-**another newsletter will go out prior to Park Party in July. Gayle Wise is co-editor.

**Zoning and Beautification** Barb Johnson reminded us that the Yard Sale is Sat., May 2. Neighbors can sell in their own yard and keep all profits. She will put ads on Craigslist and the Journal. Park Party is Sat. July 23. BANA provides hot dogs Volunteers are needed for alley clean-up.

**Elections-** Barb explained that Amy, Barb and Jeanene's board terms are up. They are all willing to serve another term of 2 years. There are 2 vacant positions and Jan's position was interim. The Board members elected to two year terms (5/1/15 to 4/30/17) are Amy Henne, Barb Johnson, Jeanene Witt, and Hart Lewis. Dana Berry and

Tom Perez will serve until 4/30/16.

A member suggested that email reminders for meeting and activities be sent out.

Another member expressed concern about some of activity in several of the homes in her vicinity. Barb suggested if the problems get worse, she should contact the landlords if these properties are rentals.

## **Bel-Air Crime Prevention—APD Wants YOU to Organize your block for a NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH**

APD has over 2000 neighborhoods in Albuquerque participating in the Neighborhood Watch program, and they would like to organize (or "reorganize") our neighborhood on a block-by-block basis.

Initially, APD looks for someone who would be willing to host in their home an organizing meeting for their block. **If you would like to be a host, follow this procedure:**

Talk with some of your neighbors on your block to see if there is general interest in participating in a Neighborhood Watch.

**If so, and if you are willing to host the initial organizing meeting, call APD to schedule at: 244-6644.**

APD will then work with you to set up the meeting. Toward the end of the organizing meeting with APD, the neighborhood will officially select someone to be the **Block Captain**, who is their contact person with the group from that point forward.

It is up to each of us to keep Bel-Air safe for all.

## **Weed Season Is Here!**

**Please remember your responsibility to maintain your property** in compliance with City of Albuquerque requirements by **ensuring that**

**any weeds with a height or spread of more than four (4) inches** are removed from the following areas:

- **Within the front, rear and/or side yards of your property;**
- **Between your property line(s) and the middle of the alley adjacent to your property;**
- **Between your property line(s) and the curb; or**
- **The area located ten feet outside your property line(s) if there is no curb**

## Water-Wise Plant Selectors

One of the most frustrating problems new gardeners to the Albuquerque area can face is trying to grow their favorite plant only to watch it wither and die due to the climate and exposure.

Gardening here is different! The soil chemistry is different, the humidity levels are different and the sun exposure is more extreme than almost anywhere else you might have gardened. No, you don't have to be satisfied with concrete or gravel.

## In honor of 2016 being a leap year, here are some facts about frogs--



1. Frogs are amphibians. Amphibians are cold-blooded vertebrates. Amphibians spend part of their lives on water and part of their lives on land.
2. There are about 4700 species of frogs in the world and are found on every continent except Antarctica.
3. Frogs can jump up to 20 times their length.
4. Frogs hibernate in the winter. During hibernation a new layer forms on their bones. The rings can tell how old a frog is, much like a tree.
5. You can tell the sex of a frog by the size of its ears: Ears larger than its eye means male. Smaller than its eye means its female.
6. Males croak to attract females. They can be heard up to a mile.
7. Frogs shed their skin and eat it about once a week.
8. Frogs' eyes help it swallow food by retracting into its head and pushing food in the mouth.
9. Most frogs are nocturnal, but some species prefer the day, depending on its preferred diet.

Amphibians are the most threatened class of animals due to extensive water pollution and the appropriation of their aquatic habitat for human needs. In the United States, there are over 230 species of amphibians, many of which are on the endangered species list.
