We also have four grandchildren and the younger two are at our house quite often these days. My career was focused on organizational/total quality management, leadership development, career counseling and training. I worked with PNM for 11 years, owned Insights Consulting Group for 15 years and I retired from the State of New Mexico in 2016 as Bureau Chief of the Professional Development Department with CYFD. I possess a Bachelor Degree in Business & Psychology and a Master's Degree in Counseling from the University of New Mexico. Having lived in this neighborhood for decades, I have seen many changes throughout the years and it has become very clear and important to me to bring my skills and knowledge and apply them to making our neighborhood a safer place to live.

I became actively involved in BANA in late Spring 2023 and was elected to the BANA board to serve as president in late May. There are several issues that BANA needs support to resolve in our neighborhood, and we can't do it alone. We need you, our neighbors, to help us be a stronger voice, for a safer and cleaner neighborhood. One of my first order of business is a concerted membership drive.

Our membership dropped substantially during COVID, leaving us with less than 40 members to date. We have approximately 1200 domiciles in our neighborhood making us one of the largest neighborhood associations in the State! Therefore, it is critical that we hear your concerns, ideas and solutions so we can begin to work for you. Once you are a registered BANA member, the Board will be able to communicate with you via email which will be more efficient and cost effective. It is important to note that it does not cost anything to be a member however, we will always accept kind donations from our neighbors. I have met with our elected officials who represent our neighborhood including Senator Ivey-Soto, Councilor Fiebelkorn, Commissioner Barboa and Representative Pajaron. I have asked for their assistance in helping us make our Bel Air Park safe for our families to enjoy, stop the crime issues that plagues our neighborhood and any additional assistance that they may provide such as capital outlay dollars, additional lighting and cameras in the park, homeless/crime resolutions and

#### Dog Park Coming to Bel Air Miramontes Park

Fall will begin construction for a dog park in our Bel Air Miramontes Park. The proposed plan and legend above show what improvements will be made. The park with have a year-round dog park of the far west side of the park as well as a seasonal dog park in the grass area near the small children's playground. The small children's playground will be removed. The grassed area will be a seasonal dog park to allow dogs to have a grassed area and mulched area to run in. However, it is anticipated that the dogs will trample the grass therefore, this area of the dog park will be closed at various times to allow for maintenance and new grass growth. The Bel Air proposed dog park plans also include:

- New 6ft, fencing on both the East and West side of park, closing the gap into the alley on the East side.
- Additional lighting will be placed on the East, West and South ends of the park
- Playground ground cover and equipment will be updated on East Side of park
- The BANA Board also asked that all existing lighting be replaced with halogen light that are brighter on the South end of the park.
